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PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Since I wrote last spring, we have had our annual meeting in Halifax at which time a number of decisions were made and follow-up action taken. Most dramatic among these was the decision of our organization to take on responsibility for the journal, For the learning of mathematics (FLM). Discussion about this proposal necessitated an extended AGM, perhaps the first in the history of the organization. It was a spirited and constructive conversation which occurred, the result of which is that membership in CMESG/GCEDM will include a subscription to FLM. Members will begin receiving FLM with the publication of issue 17(1), early in the new year. Moreover, as I write this message, a three person committee composed of Gila Hanna, Tom Kieren (Coordinator of the Committee), and David Wheeler are reviewing and sorting through applications for the Editorship of the journal. Our thanks to these folks for taking on this crucial task.

There were many highlights which one could note about the meeting in Halifax, but for me the one which comes to mind most is the unveiling of our 'new look' Proceedings. Yvonne Pothier did an absolutely marvellous job with the Proceedings. Our thanks once again to Yvonne. And speaking of publications, David Reid (Memorial) has taken on the role of Newsletter Editor and Web Page developer. I was reviewing the Web Page just prior to sitting down to write this message, and I think David, with the assistance of Linda Gattuso, is doing a great job of bringing our organization into the electronic age by putting CMESG/GCEDM on the Web map. Watch for an announcement in the next few weeks regarding the unveiling of our Web page.

Last year the election process was altered so that new Executive members would know of their election well in advance of the Annual meeting, thereby allowing them to adjust travel plans to remain for an extra day to take part in an Executive meeting. This practice will operate again this year, and hence it is important that nominations for the Executive be made in the next few weeks. Since my term on the Executive comes to an end next year, I have taken on the task of being Chair of the nomination committee. I encourage you to send me (dawson@sfu.ca) your suggestions and/or nominations no later than January 31st, 1997. The ballot will be sent out in March along with membership renewal and conference registration materials.

Speaking of the Executive, the selection of speakers and special events for next year's Annual meeting is now complete. The broad outlines for this work were established during an Executive meeting in Halifax after the Annual meeting, but the details were worked through later, mostly via email. Eric, Bernard and I did manage one short meeting in Seville when attending ICME-8, but otherwise Executive discussions have taken place over the e-waves! Though this has at times proven difficult, the tasks did get done, and the program for 1997 at the Lakehead is well on its way to finalization.

MINUTES OF THE ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING OF CMESG

[The complete minutes are long, and this is only a summary of the motions approved.]

Held at Mount St. Vincent University in Halifax. June 1, 1996 and June 2, 1996.

Sandy Dawson in the Chair, about 40 members present for the first session, about 50 for the second session.

1. Introductory remarks - Sandy Dawson

Sandy thanked the two outgoing members of the Executive, Pat Rogers and David Lidstone, for their support and contributions to CMESG/GCEDM in the past year. He also thanked Vi Maeers, in her absence, for the two Newsletters which she edited this year.

2. Minutes of 1995 AGM were approved as circulated on a motion by Gord Doctorow and Doug Franks

3. Financial report - The Treasurer presented a written year end report which was approved on a motion by Ed Barbeau and Tom Kieran. Ed Barbeau suggested the executive look into getting a Charitable status for CMESG/GCEDM so that tax receipts can be issued to donors. Carolyn Kieran suggested that it may help to change the CMESG fiscal year to the calendar year. At present the fiscal year ends April 30.

4. FLM

The following were resolved:

That commencing July 1997, the financial responsibility for FLM will be assumed by CMESG/GCEDM and that the new editors should be sought who will maintain the current spirit and thrust of FLM.

That during the period between the 1996 AGM and the 1997 AGM the Executive Committee will function as the FLM financial subcommittee".

That at the 1997 AGM the Executive present, for approval, a plan for the editorial direction of FLM, including the composition and responsibilities of (1) an editorial advisory panel for FLM, and (2) a process for the selection of editor(s) for FLM. Further the CMESG/GCEDM instructs the Executive Committee to

- (a) develop the terms of reference for an Editorial Advisory Panel for FLM,
- (b) develop the responsibilities and conditions of appointment for the Editor(s) of FLM,
- (c) develop a process for the selection and appointment of the Editor(s) of FLM,
- (d) complete the above development in time for appointments to these various offices by the Spring of 1997,
- (e) proceed on the selection and appointments for the above positions by the Spring of 1997, and
- (f) at the 1997 AGM of CMESG/GCEDM present for approval item (a) and report for information on items (b), (c), (d), (e).

and that the term for the first Editor(s) be set at a maximum of three years, to be reviewed at termination.
That starting with 1997 all CMESG/GCEDM members automatically receive FLM at a \$20 fee.

5. ELECTIONS

Pat Rogers explained the new process which had been implemented this year to ensure that elections were complete in time for a new Executive to take over after this AGM and also in time for those individuals to plan their travel so as to stay on an extra day for an Executive meeting. She reported that Bernard Hodgson and Lesley Lee were elected to the executive for a 2 year term. Sandy indicated that Mary Crowley and Sue Stuart have been appointed to the executive for 1 year terms.

6. FUTURE MEETINGS

In 1997 the Group will meet at Lakehead University. For 1998 an invitation from UBC has been accepted, the dates for that meeting are May 29th to June 2nd, 1998.

7. SSHRC APPLICATION for 1997 meeting

As indicated in the Newsletter, the Executive will be going ahead with an application for 1997. The Secretary indicated that he had met with Carolyn Kieren, Tom Kieran, Claude Gaulin and Bill Higginson to get ideas to improve the introductory page for the application.

8. NEWSLETTER

The question was posed as to whether the Newsletter could only be sent on the new List Serve or whether members still required hard copies. It was felt that both versions should be available this year and that the membership could then be polled.

COMPTE RENDU DE L'ASSEMBLÉE GÉNÉRALE ANNUELLE DU GROUPE CANADIEN D'ÉTUDE EN DIDACTIQUE DES MATHÉMATIQUES

Université Mount Saint Vincent, Halifax, 1er et 2 juin 1996

[Pour des raisons de longueur, ceci est une version abrégée du compte rendu.]

Sandy Dawson agit comme président, environ 40 membres étant présents la première journée et 50 la deuxième.

1. Remarques préliminaires — Sandy Dawson

Sandy remercie les deux membres sortants du Comité exécutif, Pat Rogers et David Lidstone, pour leur soutien et leur contribution au GCEDM/CMESG au cours de la dernière année. Il remercie également Vi Maeers, en son absence, pour avoir agi comme éditrice de deux numéros du Bulletin au cours de l'année.

2. Le compte rendu de la rencontre de 1995 est approuvé sur proposition de Gord Doctorow et de Doug Franks.

3. Rapport financier

Le secrétaire-trésorier présente par écrit son rapport financier annuel ; celui-ci est approuvé sur proposition d'Ed Barbeau et de Tom Kieran. Ed Barbeau suggère que l'Exécutif examine la possibilité que le GCEDM/CMESG obtienne le statut lui permettant d'émettre des reçus de charité pour fins d'impôts. Carolyn Kieran suggère qu'il pourrait être avantageux de changer l'année fiscale de façon à ce qu'elle coïncide avec l'année du calendrier, plutôt que de se terminer le 30 avril comme c'est le cas actuellement.

4. FLM

Voici les conclusions de la discussion sur les relations entre le GCEDM/CMESG et FLM.

- À compter de juillet 1997, la responsabilité financière de FLM incombera au GCEDM/CMESG, qui verra également à trouver de nouveaux éditeurs devant maintenir l'esprit et le dynamisme actuel de FLM.
- Durant la période comprise entre les assemblées générales annuelles de 1996 et de 1997, le Comité exécutif agira en tant que sous-comité des finances de FLM.
- Lors de l'Assemblée générale annuelle de 1997, le Comité exécutif présentera, pour fins d'approbation, un plan sur la conduite éditoriale de FLM, définissant entre autres (1) la composition et les responsabilités d'un comité éditorial consultatif, et (2) un processus pour le choix du (des) éditeur(s) de FLM. De plus, le GCEDM/CMESG demande au Comité exécutif de
 - (a) définir le mandat du Comité éditorial consultatif de FLM
 - (b) déterminer les responsabilités du (des) éditeur(s) de FLM de même que les conditions d'occupation du poste
 - (c) concevoir un processus de sélection et de désignation du (des) éditeur(s) de FLM
 - (d)achever la description de ce processus à temps pour des nominations devant se faire d'ici le printemps 1997
 - (e) choisir les titulaires des différents postes d'ici le printemps 1997
 - (f) lors de l'Assemblée générale annuelle de 1997, faire approuver les décisions quant au point (a) et faire rapport sur les points (b), (c), (d) et (e).
- La durée du mandat du (des) premier(s) éditeur(s) devra être au maximum de trois ans et sera sujet à révision à la fin du mandat.
- À compter de 1997, tous les membres du GCEDM/CMESG recevront automatiquement FLM, le coût de la cotisation étant de 20\$.

5. Élections

Pat Rogers présente le nouveau mode d'élections mis en place cette année. L'objectif visé, en tenant le vote plus tôt, est de permettre au nouvel Exécutif de prendre la relève sitôt après l'assemblée générale annuelle, et aussi de faire en sorte que les membres nouvellement élus puissent planifier leur transport de façon à permettre à l'Exécutif de se réunir pour une journée à la fin de la rencontre annuelle.

Pat déclare Bernard Hodgson et Lesley Lee élus au Comité exécutif pour une période de deux ans. Sandy indique que Mary Crowley et Sue Stuart ont été cooptés à l'Exécutif pour une période d'un an.

6. Rencontres futures

La rencontre de 1997 se tiendra à l'Université Lakehead. Pour 1998, l'Exécutif a accepté l'invitation de UBC, les dates de la rencontre étant du 29 mai au 2 juin 1998.

7. Demande de subvention au CRSH pour 1997

Tel que mentionné dans le Bulletin, le Comité exécutif préparera une demande de subvention pour 1997. Le secrétaire-trésorier signale qu'il s'est entretenu avec Carolyn Kieran, Tom Kieren, Claude Gaulin et Bill Higginson pour recueillir des idées sur la façon d'améliorer la page de présentation de la demande.

8. Bulletin

Le Bulletin doit-il toujours paraître imprimé sur papier, ou une version électronique peut-elle suffire ? On convient que les deux modes de transmission doivent être disponibles cette année et qu'un sondage auprès des membres pourrait ensuite être fait.


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MEMBER REPORTS
